




Beverley Healy

House Whisperings

Self-taught fibre artist Linda O'Kane brings a wonderfully quirky, lovingly created collection of papier-mâché and spun cotton little houses.

Taking inspiration from local vernacular architecture, but not slavishly copying, she imbues her houses with a touch of whimsy, nostalgia and lots of personality. 'A sense of home and comfort has always been very important to me. Abandoned houses especially, seem to whisper...... love me'.

Thurs 2 May - Sat 1 Jun **Keith Sheppard** Gallery 1

Following a life changing accident in 2009, resulting in paralysis from the waist down, Keith defied medical opinion by walking seven months later, and beginning his life again as a glass artist. The metal fused vertebrae that enables him to walk has a relevance to the works he now creates.

From producing tableware to high-end bespoke pieces, which include sculptures and installations. Keith's artistry involves infusing glass with metals to create unique, vibrant colourations in interesting forms.





Thurs 2 - Sat 18 May ArtEast Gallery 2

A group of female Chinese artists got together in 2015 with aims to foster excellence and promote appreciation of Chinese culture and art in Northern Ireland. Since 2017 a series of exhibitions and workshops with the theme of Magic Brush have occurred in Lisburn, Belfast and elsewhere. 2024 marks the Chinese New Year of the Dragon, and this exhibition promises to bring powerful, confident, beautiful works celebrating Chinese art's rich heritage.

Tues 21 May - Sat 1 Jun **Harmony Hill Craft Group** Fortieth Anniversary Exhibition Return of the Divas Gallery 2

> First established in 1984 at Harmony Hill Arts Centre, the council's arts venue before ISLAND Arts Centre, the group continues to meet weekly. The highlight of their year is the annual exhibition, when a visual treat of techniques is displayed, with many items available to buy. This special commemorative exhibition with the aptly named theme Return of the Divas promises a rich range of crafts including quilting, tapestry, creative embroidery, knitting, felting, beading and lace work.

This exhibition's theme centres around the need to raise awareness of critical, ethical issues related to the global fashion system. The works take the form of fashion illustrations, including three-dimensional paper illustrations, and textile illustrations, some of which include deconstructed recycled and discarded garments. The collection aims to draw attention to problems caused by the fashion industry such as exploitation of the earth's resources, environmental degradation, overconsumption, poor labour practices and exploitation of people.
























Mayor's Carnival Parade 2024 'Country Comes to The City'


